Blessing of the Crèche

Priest: +Alleluia! Christ is born!

People: Praise and glory to Christ the Lord forever and ever.

Priest: The glory of the Lord has been revealed, alleluia!

People: And all flesh shall see the salvation by our God, alleluia!

Priest: Let us pray.

Father of all goodness, let this crib recall that Jesus is one with you as God, and yet came to be one with us as the child laid in the manger. Let his mind be in us, and let our hearts be lifted up to contemplate the glory that is your divine humanity; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.

People: Amen.

[The priest sprinkles the crèche with holy water, and honors it with incense, setting it apart as a holy reminder during the season of Christ's coming among us]

The Holy Gospel - Luke 2.1-14

Priest: +The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke *People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.* Readers:

It was about that same time that Augustus Caesar sent out an order to all people in the countries that were under Roman rule. The order said that everyone's name must be put on a list. This was the first counting of all the people while Quirinius was governor of Syria. Everyone traveled to their own hometowns to have their name put on the list.

So, Joseph left Nazareth, a town in Galilee, and went to the

The shepherds were very afraid. The angel said to them, "Don't be afraid. I have some very good news for you—news that will make everyone happy. Today your Savior was born in David's town. He is the Messiah, the Lord. This is how you will know him: You will find a baby wrapped in pieces of cloth and lying in a feeding box."

Then a huge army of angels from heaven joined the first angel, and they were all praising God, saying, "Praise God in heaven, and on earth let there be peace to the people who please him." The angels left the shepherds and went back to heaven. The shepherds said to each other, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this great event the Lord has told us about."

So, they went running and found Mary and Joseph. And there was the baby, lying in the feeding box. When they saw the baby, they told what the angels said about this child. Everyone was surprised when they heard what the shepherds told them. Mary continued to think about these things, trying to understand them. The shepherds went back to their sheep, praising God and thanking him for everything they had seen and heard. It was just as the angel had told them.

Reader: Make our thoughts good, Almighty God, every single day. We know that one day you will send Jesus back to us. Then, he will live with us forever. Let us remember him more and more every day. We pray this in Jesus's name. *People: Amen.*

Reader: O God, you make us happy. Each year we get to remember that Jesus was born just like us. Help us to remember him and to become friends with him. Give us happy hearts so that one day, when we see him again, we are happy and not sad. We pray this in Jesus's name.

People: Amen.

Reader: O God, you have caused this holy night to shine brightly. The light of the world has come, and his name is Jesus. Help us to know Jesus more and more. And one day, bring us back together with him, so that we can see by his light. We pray this in Jesus's name.

People: Amen.

Reader: Almighty God, you gave us your only Son. He became human just like we are. He was born on this day, two thousand and twenty- three years ago. Help us to remember him. Help us to

live like your adopted children. And help us to honor you with our whole lives. We pray this in Jesus's name. *People: Amen.*

Priest: Christmas celebrates a great mystery: Here in this gathering our God comes to us. Let us open our hearts to this mystery of redemption, and confess our sins, kneeling as we are able...

[We silently ask God to forgive all the sins we remember]

Priest: Lord Jesus, Son of God, who at your human birth became our brother: Lord, have mercy.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: Christ Jesus, Son of Man, who through your human nature have experienced our weakness: Christ, have mercy.

People: Christ, have mercy.

Priest: Lord Jesus, Only-Begotten, who in your risen flesh have bound us into one body: Lord, have mercy.

People: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Savior forgive you your sins [+] and make you holy to serve him in the world, through the same, his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.


People: We lift them to the Lord.


[The chime is struck to call our attention to the presence of Christ under the form of bread]

[The chime is struck to call our attention to the presence of Christ under the form of wine]

Memorial Acclamation



Priest: Father, we now obey your Son's command. We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom. Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves, a single, holy, living sacrifice.

Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us [~] and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by the same Spirit's life-giving power, they may be the Body [+] and Blood of your Son, and we [+] may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptized into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, the apostles, and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

"I believe that you are truly present in the Holy Sacrament, and, since I cannot at this time receive communion, I pray you to come into my heart. I unite myself with you and embrace you with all my heart, my soul, and my mind. Let nothing separate me from you; let me serve you in this life until, by your grace, I come to your glorious kingdom and unending peace.

"Come Lord Jesus, and dwell in my heart in the fullness of your strength; be my wisdom and guide me in right pathways; conform my life and actions to the image of your holiness; and, in the power of your gracious might, rule over every hostile power that threatens or disturbs the growth of your kingdom, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting.
